

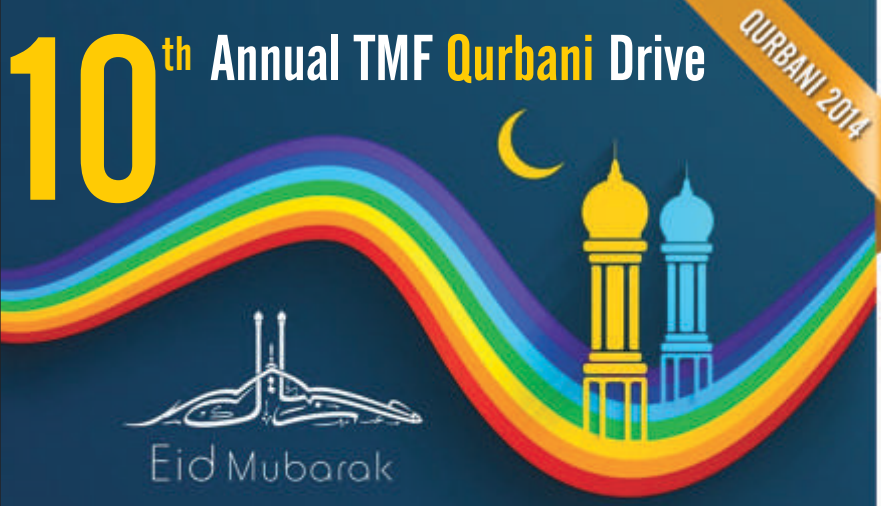


TAMEER-E-MILLAT NEWSLETTER



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Education plays a vital role in human capital formation. It raises the productivity and efficiency of individuals and thus produces skilled manpower that is capable of leading the economy towards the path of sustainable economic development. Unfortunately, in Pakistan, the low enrolment rates at the primary level, wide disparities between regions and gender, lack of trained teachers, deficiency of proper training materials and poor physical infrastructure of schools indicate the poor performance of the sector.

Established in 1987, Tameer-e-Millat Foundation (TMF) is committed to provide education through establishing community primary schools, model schools, vocational training centers, technical institutes, literacy centers, teachers' training institutes, culminating into premier higher educational institutions with the objective to develop the human resource in and from the marginalized communities of the country. Currently, TMF is running over 237 educational institutions, educating 17,451 students and serving 700 communities in 22 districts of the country.

Celebrating Eid-ul-Adha

Eid-ul Adha means "The Festival of Sacrifice." It starts on 10th Dhul Hajj, and lasts for 3 days. Muslims who can afford to sacrifice domestic animals (usually goat, sheep, cattle or camel) do so, as a symbol of Prophet Ibrahim (AS)'s ultimate sacrifice as mentioned in the Quran (Surah Saffat, verses 102-108); this sacrifice is called "Qurbani." The meat is equally distributed amongst themselves, their neighbors and relatives, and the poor and hungry. Since 2005, TMF has been arranging Qurbani on your behalf and donating the meat and skins to the orphans and deserving students studying in Tameer-e-Jannat Science School, a complete educational and residential facility at TM City of Education, Fateh Jang, District Attock. Every year, TMF has continued its efforts and sponsored the children of the 2005 earthquake hit regions, internally displaced children of KPK and the 2010-2011 flood affectees.

Since its establishment in 1987, TMF has organized 250 Teacher training programs and seminars which proved to be fruitful for the professional development of about 4,000 teachers. Therefore to revive its practice of providing opportunities of professional and career enhancements to its teachers, TMF organized a 3 day teacher training program at Tameer-e-Millat City of Education (TMCE), Ratwal, Fateh Jang on June 10, 11 and 12, 2014. All the teachers, male and female, across the network were invited to attend this training course to gain advancement in their teaching talent and capabilities. Teachers from TMF schools in Khewra, Daryala Jalip, Pind Dadan Khan, Lilla, Jethal, Chawinda, Thoha Khalsa, Tarlai Kalan, Islamabad, Dhandka and TMCE attended the session.



Al-Huda Teachers Education Centre (ATEC) served as the training provider. The training session was formally started with the recitation of the Holy Quran. Afterwards General Secretary TMF, Professor Basharat Ahmed, welcomed the teachers and trainers on behalf of TMF. Vice chairperson Dr. Samea K. Ahmad gave a brief introduction of TMF and encouraged the teachers to

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maximize their learning through active participation. She appreciated their commitment to teaching and willingness to improve as many of them left their families and traveled long distances in the extreme hot weather to participate in this event. After the introductory remarks, the training session proceeded as

planned by the trainers. The participants of the course were very enthusiastic, throughout the session, about learning new teaching methodologies and improving their way of teaching in their respective schools.

The interactive training session encouraged active participation by the participants hence increasing the effectiveness of the training program. The training session included key topics of paramount nature including:

COLLABORATION WITH PUNJAB SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND



Tameer-e-Millat Foundation in collaboration with the Punjab Skill Development Fund (PSDF) sponsored by UKAID has initiated skills development training. The prime purpose of this training is to remove poverty and dearth by producing skillful labor force. The training is intended to result in employment and business opportunities in-order to uplift the living standards of the youth. This project is focused on the poor and vulnerable populations of the six poorest districts of South Punjab for improving their ability to find or progress in their current employment. As an implementing partner, TMF through Tameer-e-Millat Institute of Technology (TMIT) has trained 69 trainees in three trade groups i.e. Electrician, Repair & maintenance of Electrical Home Appliances and Quantity Surveyor. The training was designed for a period of 06 months. TMF remained among the highest achievers by successfully training 92% of the enrolled trainees. These trainees not only availed free of cost training but were also served with free food, residence and an allowance of 3000 PKR each month.



Under the stated initiative, the second batch of 75 trainees has started their six months training at TMIT from June 04, 2014. Second batch will carry forward with their training in the same trade groups. Necessary books, uniform, and training material has been provided to the students so that training may be continued uninterrupted. TMF is determined to provide quality training to its trainees as per industry requirements and will also collaborate with various employers for job placement as well as providing assistance in establishing their own businesses.

Recognizing the commitment and dedication of the participating teachers and the dire need for continuous training programs for in-service teachers, Vice Chairperson Dr. Samea K. Ahmad, is determined to keep this tradition going in order to equip the teachers with the latest developments in teaching methods. The participants were hopeful about their performance in the future as they pledged to improve their way of teaching in the light of latest learnt techniques.

Tameerian Excel in Matric Exams

Maintaining the tradition of best performers, students of Tameer-e-Millat schools network showed excellent results in their relevant secondary schools examinations. 260 students from 14 schools participated in the Secondary School Examinations, of which 222 students successfully cleared their tests. Success rate was noted to be 85.38% across the network. Tameer-e-Millat Hazara Public School Shinkari for Girls was the top achiever. 29 girl students appeared in the exam and all remained successful with distinction. Two students secured "A+" grades, 14 "A", 7 "B", and 6 students secured "C" grade. Aymen Khan from Shinkari stood first across the TMF network.
